## TIM LUCAS, DIRECTOR OF KDE FACILITIES MANAGEMENT & MIKE SPARKMAN, PRESIDENT OF ALT 32 PRESENTATION

Tim Lucas, Director of the Kentucky Department of Education Facilities Management Branch, and Mike Sparkman, President of the Alt 32 Architect firm discussed options the district should consider in development of our new District Facility Plan (DFP). In order to meet the June deadline for approval by the Kentucky Board of Education, Lee County must submit their proposed DFP to Frankfort by mid-May. The Kentucky Department of Education will review the proposed plan and compare it to regulatory requirements. Mr. Lucas informed board members that SEEK and Capital Outlay funds are based on the number of students we have and as our enrollment continues to decline, so does our funding. Mr. Lucas advised that as we develop a new DFP, we must think about where we are going and pledged KDE's support and help as we move forward.

## BEATTYVILLE ELEMENTARY SBDM PRESENTATION

Maureen Patrick, Beattyville Elementary Principal, and several staff members provided the SBDM presentation for board members. Teacher and archery coach, Kendra Napier and instructional assistant, Vicky Charles, discussed the archery team's success this year. Beattyville Elementary's Archery Team finished second in the region, with four students qualifying for state. Tony Barrett - Music/Band Teacher, Brent Duncil - Physical Education Teacher, and Melissa Smith - Art Teacher, shared information regarding their work on the Program Review which will be 23% of the school's score. Cheri Murrey discussed benefits of the school's Reading Recovery program. Fourth grade teacher Cindy Neiderman, who also serves as the school's Lighthouse Coordinator, informed the board that the Lighthouse program provides extra tutoring and assistance with homework to approximately 75 students on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. Fifth grade teachers Jay Dailey and Natasha Ratliff, along with student, James Watterson, demonstrated



applications on the iPads utilized by fifth grade students. Teachers Karen Stansbury, Cynthia Johnson, Candice Sizemore, Katrina Broadus, and Bethany Hobbs discussed programs and initiatives implemented in their classrooms to increase student achievement.

Ms. Arnold provides services to students at Beattyville Elementary and Southside Elementary Schools, while Ms. Stickler serves Lee County Middle and Lee County High School students.

Southside Elementary Principal Steve Carroll, and Lee County High School Principal, Mark Murray provided updates on their current 30-60-90 plans.

## 2012-2013 SCHOOL CALENDAR UPDATE

Ray Shuler, Director of Pupil Personnel, provided an update on the 2012-2013 School Calendar. Lee County has now missed seven (7) instructional days due to inclement weather, and dismissed early one (1) day due to a bomb threat. The last day of student attendance is currently scheduled as May 14<sup>th</sup>.

## 2012-2013 ATTENDANCE UPDATE

Ray Shuler, Director of Pupil Personnel, provided the monthly attendance update. The current district-wide attendance rate is 92.59%, up slightly from the rate of 92.52% this same time last year.

Ray Shuler, Director of Pupil Personnel, presented the proposed 2013-2014 School Calendar recommended by the Calendar Committee for board review and approval. ## MONTHLY BUDGET REPORT

Zina Gibson, District Finance Officer, provided the monthly budget report of projected expenditures and revenue. Lee County has received \$165,000.00 loss in funding this school year due to a reduction in State SEEK funding and Federal programs including Title I, IDEA-B Rural & Low Income, Gear UP, 21st Century, and Title IIA. The Kentucky Commissioner of Education has advised districts to plan for the worst case scenario and budget for an additional 10% reduction in education funds for the upcoming 2013-2014 school year.
