LEE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT ANNOUNCES STOP! TIPLINE ... REPORT BULLYING "ONLINE"


Safety is our first priority. In an effort to use every available resource to STOP bullying and other risky behaviors in our schools, Lee County School District proudly announces the implementation of the "Safety Tipline Online Prevention" or STOP! Tipline. The STOP! Tipline is designed for use as an "online" reporting/prevention tool which is provided free by the Kentucky Center for School Safety. If students, parents or community members know of an unsafe situation in school (bullying, weapons, drugs or alcohol, etc.), they can anonymously pass on that information to school personnel by using this basic email format.

"Our hope is that, students who fear face-to-face reporting of bullying or other safety issues may be less reluctant to share this vital information when offered an "online" option, "says Superintendent Jim Evans. By giving students the ability to report concerns over their tablets, computers or mobile phones, we can reach more students and address problems before they escalate."

The process for using the tip line involves locating the STOP Tipline logo on the Lee County School District website at www.lee@kyschools.us. Simply click on the Downloads & Links tab at the top right of the district home page. You will see the STOP Tipline logo in the right-hand column. Clicking on the logo gives you direct access to the tipline. This logo may also be found in the same location on each school web page. School pages may be accessed

directly from the district home page by clicking on the preferred school name in the upper section of the left-hand column.

Immediately, students or community members can anonymously report bullying, cyberbullying, violence, risky behavior or other safety concerns to

KINDERFEST SCHEDULED JUNE 6TH

(Kindergarten Registration)

Lee County School District will hold "Kinderfest"

(kindergarten registration) at the Happy Top Community Center on Friday, June 6th, 2014 from 2:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m.

The main goal of Kinderfest is to make certain we meet all children who will be entering kindergarten in the Lee County School District during the 2014-2015 school year and provide them with the registration packet containing information and forms required for enrollment.

Several enrollment packets were mailed earlier to those parents who had informed the district that their child would be entering kindergarten during the upcoming school year. We ask that these parents bring the completed enrollment forms with them to Kinderfest. School and district staff will be on-hand to assist parents with any questions regarding enrollment. To be eligible to attend kindergarten during the 2014-

2015 school year, students must be five (5) years of age by October 1, 2014.

Required documents for enrollment include:

- Certified Birth Certificate (hospital birth records not accepted)
- Social Security Card
- Valid up-to-date Immunization Certificate
- Preventive Health Care Examination
- Kentucky Eye Examination
- Proof of Completed Dental Screening
- Student Registration Form

Transportation personnel will be available to assign bus schedules for new kindergarten students and district staff will assist parents in establishing a Parent Portal Account. **Please come out and join us!**
