INSTRUCTION

Sharon Bush, Instructional Supervisor reported the following: Credit Recovery training will be held Friday; all schools are working on TPGES – Mr. Mark Murray is piloting the principal evaluation; all schools are working on their CSIP – they must address gaps by

October 1, 2013. The Comparability Report is complete – 7.35 teachers are paid from Title I.

REVIEW AND DISCUSS TITLE II REPORT

Sharon Bush, Instructional Supervisor, provided a Title II Report. Title II funds are currently used primarily for class size reduction. We pay 2 ½ teachers from Title II. Remaining Title II funds are used to pay tuition for staff members returning to school to obtain dual credit certification.

PRINCIPAL REPORTS

Each principal reported to board members on implementation of their individual School Communication Plans, and provided 30-60-90 Plan updates.

TRANSPORTATION REPORT

Ray Shuler, Director of Pupil Personnel, reported on transportation. Of the 1055 students currently enrolled, 758 are transported by bus. 617 of these are transported both to and from school, with 129 transported only one way. 12 students are transported on the special needs bus. Our fleet consists of 23 buses total (2 handicap and 21 regular) of which 15 are completely depreciated out. We currently run 15 regular buses per day. No new buses have been purchased in the last two years.

ATTENDANCE UPDATE/REVIEW DROP-OUT RATE & QUESTIONNAIRE

Director of Pupil Personnel, Ray Shuler, provided the 2012-2013 Dropout Report. There were a total of three (3) drop outs (two males & one female). Of these three, there was one (1) sophomore and two (2) seniors. All listed failing classes as the reason for dropping out of school. Of these three, one senior returned to school this year and one obtained a GED.
